Dear Parents,

Illinois state law requires that Glenview School District 34 must have the following on file:

Upon entering our school district for the first time AND AGAIN prior to entering Kindergarten and prior to 6th grade:

Physical Exam (no more than one year old) and Immunization record

For Kindergarten OR first time students to the District beyond Kindergarten:

Eye Exam prior to October 15th of the current school year (must be done within previous 12 months)

For students in Kindergarten, 2nd and 6th grades:

Dental Exam prior to May 15th of the current school year (must be done within previous 18 months)

If a child fails to present proof of an eye or dental exam by the above timeline, the school may hold the child's report card until one (or more, if applicable) of the following occur:

- child presents proof of a completed examination
- child presents proof that an eye exam will take place within 60 days after October 15
- child presents proof that a dental exam will take place within 60 days after May 15
- child presents a dental or eye examination waiver
- child presents an exemption based on religious grounds

Enclosed is a physical examination form to be completed by your physician. It must be returned to your school office on or before the first day of school with appropriate areas completed and all dates properly filled in. Your child will not be able to start school until the physical examination form is turned in. Forms for Eye and Dental Examinations are enclosed in this mailing as well.

District 34 is working with Ronald McDonald House to provide physical examinations and vaccinations for those needing financial assistance. Please contact your school's Health Coordinator for more information.

District 34 is also working with Smile Illinois to provide dental examinations for those needing financial assistance. Please contact the Social Worker or Health Coordinator at your school for more information in regard to financial aid.

Your child's health is important to us and is an important factor in entering school ready to learn. If you have any questions regarding any of the information contained herein, please feel free to call your school office.
